



Course Description

ASL2430 | Manual alphabet Skills Development | 3.00 credits

The course content focuses on acquiring both expressive and receptive skills in the manual alphabet of American Sign Language, commonly known as fingerspelling. A performance test is given at the beginning of the course to determine existing competency. Prerequisites: ASL1140C, 1150C.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency in recognizing and interpreting fingerspelling by:

1. Practicing daily recognition drills
2. Participating in interactive finger-spelling exercises
3. Engaging in receptive fingerspelling activities with peers

Competency 2: The student will develop expressive fingerspelling skills by:

1. Practicing fingerspelling in front of a mirror
2. Participating in expressive fingerspelling role-plays
3. Engaging in fingerspelling storytelling exercises

Competency 3: The student will apply fingerspelling in real-life scenarios by:

1. Participating in fingerspelling conversations with fluent signers
2. Using fingerspelling in practical everyday situations
3. Engaging in the fingerspelling interpretation of short texts or conversations

- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
